The successful candidate will hold a Ph.D. in finance. The candidate will preferably be interested or have experience in teaching investment management, investment banking, corporate finance, and contributing to the student managed portfolio trust. Teaching interests in other relevant areas may also be considered.

The candidate is also expected to teach graduate courses and supervise research oriented graduate students (M.Sc. Finance & Ph.D. Applied Economics). The ideal candidate will be willing to work in a collaborative, collegial environment where teaching expertise and the ability to publish research in top finance journals is highly valued. Candidates should be familiar with Bloomberg terminals, and having a professional finance designation (e.g. CFA) is a plus.
